**Subject: DGFT Initiative on Supply Chain Resilience – Request for Inputs from Services Exporters**

Dear Sir/Madam,

This is to inform that the **Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT)**, Department of Commerce, Government of India, has operationalised an **Inter-Ministerial Group (IMG) on Supply Chain Resilience** through **Trade Notice No. 30/2025-26**.

The initiative aims to strengthen India's export ecosystem by monitoring global developments affecting supply chains and export flows, identifying sector-specific vulnerabilities, and recommending timely policy interventions to mitigate risks. The mechanism will also facilitate coordination among Ministries and engagement with Export Promotion Councils and industry stakeholders.

In this regard, the **Services Export Promotion Council (SEPC)** has been requested to share sector-specific feedback from services exporters on issues affecting export operations.

**Inputs Requested**

Members are requested to share any **supply-chain related challenges impacting services exports**, including:

- Digital infrastructure or connectivity issues affecting cross-border service delivery
- Restrictions impacting movement of professionals
- Regulatory or compliance barriers affecting export of services
- Dependence on overseas technology platforms or digital ecosystems
- Any other global developments impacting services exports

The inputs received will be consolidated by SEPC and submitted to the Directorate General of Foreign Trade for consideration under the Supply Chain Resilience framework.
